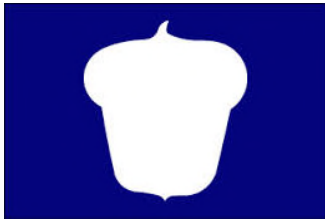
have such a great time I'm sure you and your family/friends would all enjoy it. I hope to see you all there.

MESSAGE FROM OUR FLEET CAPTAIN: BILL WEBER



Hello to all, several boats took a spur of moment 12.3 nm jaunt to Dennis Point over the weekend. Miss Smitten, Greasy Monkey and Maybe Later spent a wonderful afternoon and evening at the Flip Flop pool side bar. Blues Chaser also stopped by for lunch.

Dennis Point has really done a good job with the Marina, very clean; we had lunch and dinner at the restaurant, food was very good. Try their pizza, it was great. They also serve an all you can eat breakfast, with an egg omelet station all for \$10 a person. The bath houses have individual bathrooms that are clean and nice. The best news for all of our K9 boaters is that Dennis Point has a fenced in doggy park with plenty of room to run and play.

While we were over in the St. Mary's River, Ellen and I checked out a Restaurant on St. George Island. The Ruddy Duck Brewery & Grill is located on the back side of the island about ¼ nm south of the bridge. If your air draft is less than 17', you could make it under the bridge, otherwise approach from the south off St Mary's river. The restaurant dock has 5'3" depth at the T head, with at least 4'6" for about 60' on either side of the dock towards the shore line. The approach depth to the dock showed 12' to 15' 100 yards off the end and would make for some good anchorage overnight. (GPS location 38 7'50"N 76 29'41"W) They do not charge for dockage and they do not have 30/50 amp electric. You can check them out at www.ruddyduckbrewery.com

Next official cruise that is on the schedule is to Summers Cove Marine at Crisfield, MD for Labor day weekend, however you do not need to wait for an official cruise to get credit for a Yacht Club cruise and be eligible for a hand in the Poker contest.

If three or more Yacht Club members get together and cruise to another marina, each will qualify to receive a Poker hand to be in the Poker contest. Please let me know who, when and where you went and all Captains will receive a poker hand.

While not an Official cruise this year; the Point Lookout marina Bluegrass event has been changed to a Tropical Dance Party. Point Lookout marina is 11.5 nm from OLCM and is a great location for a quick cruise to enjoy the food and music.

Tournament on August 22, 2015
Sign-Up Sheet Is In the Clubhouse***

Again this year, since some of our junior anglers are not so “junior” anymore, we have a teen division. All teens, ages 13 through 19, are eligible to participate.

Rules for the Junior Division remain the same:

1. All children 12 and under are eligible to participate.
2. ALL Anglers must be pre-registered by August 15th -- no exceptions please.
3. Final weigh-in of fish at 2:00 PM on A Dock.
4. Fishing is allowed from the dock or a boat, angler’s choice. All species of fish will be considered.
5. No restrictions on the body of water that is fished, but anglers must depart from Olverson's Marina at 9:00 AM and return by 2:00 PM for weigh-in.
6. Awards to the Junior Anglers will be presented at the Function that evening.

Rules for the Teen Division are as follows:

1. All children 13 through 19 are eligible to participate.
2. All Anglers must be pre-registered by August 15th -- no exceptions, please.
3. Final weigh-in of fish at 2:00 PM on A Dock.
4. Fishing is allowed from the dock or a boat, angler’s choice. All species of fish will be considered.
5. No restrictions on the body of water that is fished, but anglers must depart Olverson's Marina at 9:00 AM and return by 2:00 AM for weigh-in.
6. Awards to the Teen Anglers will be presented at the Function that evening.
