DSC & MMSI

Digital Select Calling (DSC) and Maritime Mobile Service Identity (MMSI) work together to make newest generation of VHF radios perform more than just a radio to "hail and talk". A programmed DCS capable VHF radio with a MMSI number will make your radio act like a phone with direct calling to another boat, however the conversation is still in the clear for all on that channel to hear, but you will not need to hail the other boat on Channel 16. A DSC radio also has the option to connect to your GPS, with 2 wires in most cases, to allow your position to also be broadcasted in some cases. This feature allows you or someone else to push one button to broadcast a distress message with your exact location directly to the Coast Guard and all other boats in the area that have a DSC radio. This gives everyone on board the ability to call for help if needed without having to figure out your current position.

Does your radio have the DSC and do you have a MMSI number? If the radio was manufactured within the past 10 years, then most likely, yes. Does it have a RED distress button? If it does then you have a DSC capable radio.

If you do not have a MMSI number you can obtain one free from BOATUS directly online. This is a great safety feature that anyone can use and costs little or nothing to

add to your boat.

Once you obtain an MMSI number, it will need to be programmed into your radio. Depending on the radio this may be simple or a little complicated. I would recommend if you are not comfortable doing this that you contact a bridge member and they will find someone to assist you.

If there is much interest in the use of DSC and adding this capability to member's boats, a short workshop could be conducted to expand on the additional uses and features of the DSC radio. If this is something that you might be interested in let a bridge member know and we will see about putting something together for early next year.



RECIPE CORNER



Southern Peach Cobbler

8 fresh peaches - peeled, pitted and sliced into thin wedges

1/4 cup white sugar

1/4 cup brown sugar

1/4 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1/8 teaspoon ground nutmeg

1 teaspoon fresh lemon juice

2 teaspoons cornstarch

1 cup all purpose flour

1/4 cup white sugar

1/4 cup brown sugar

1 teaspoon baking powder

1/2 teaspoon salt

6 tablespoons unsalted butter, chilled and cut into small pieces

1/4 cup boiling water

Mix together: 3 tablespoons white sugar 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon

1. Preheat oven to 425 degrees.

2. In a large bowl, combine peaches, 1/4 cup white sugar, 1/4 cup brown sugar, 1/4 teaspoon cinnamon, nutmeg, lemon juice and cornstarch. Toss to coat evenly, and pour into a 2 quart baking dish. Bake in preheated oven for 10 minutes.

3. In a large bowl, combine flour, 1/4 cup white sugar, 1/4 cup brown sugar, baking powder and salt. Blend in butter with your hands until mixture resembles coarse meal. Stir in water until just combined.

4. Remove peaches from oven, and drop spoonfuls of topping over them. Sprinkle entire cobbler with the sugar and cinnamon mixture. Bake until topping is golden, about 30 minutes.
