MESSAGE FROM OUR VICE COMMODORE - STEVE THOMPSON



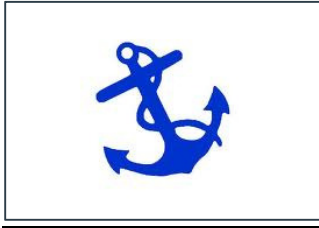

FLEET CAPTAIN – BILL WEBER



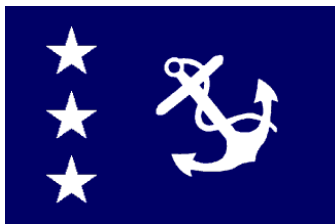
Hi All,
