BOATERS SAFE BOATHING COURSE - Effective July 1, 2019 all Virginia boater must have taken a Certified Boaters Safe Boating Course and have proof of this while boathing in Virginia waters while operating any vessel powered by a motor of at least 10 hoursepower. This law makes no distinction of age or experience.

As we start the boating season, we must all renew our commitment for SAFE BOATING.

<u>VESSEL SAFETY CHECKS</u> - The most cautious boaters can sometimes experience unexpected problems on the water. That's why the U.S. Coast Guard recommends that all recreational boaters, including personal watercraft and paddle sport users take advantage of the free Vessel Safety Check Program every year. We have certified Vessel Safety Check Examiners here at Olverson's Marina. Please contact the Marina Office and office personnel will provide you with contact information for getting this free examination. Once you have completed this free 15-minute examination, you will be given a decal that can proudly be displayed on your vessel. Taking a few minutes to have your vessel checked, just may save you from problems this season!

## MESSAGE FROM YOUR SAFETY OFFICER

As we approach the 2019 boating season, we have a renewed sense of awareness of Boating Safety. First, we must be sure that our boats are as safe as possible. Erik Amato and I are the Vessel Safety Examiners that are "on-site" and always available to do a FREE Courtesy Vessel Safety Check. Once your boat passes the Safety Check, you get a decal that you can display for the entire season. It lets people know that you have taken the time to be "Safety Conscious."

Then, there is the Safe Boating Education Class If you are operating a vessel in Virginia waters, over 10 horsepower, you are required to carry your Boater Certification Card with you and be able to show it to Law Enforcement. LCYC and Olverson's Marina are sponsoring the 1-day Boater Safety Class (Free) on Saturday, May 11th at the clubhouse. Lunch is provided too! At the end of the class, you will receive your Boater Certification Card, which is good as a "lifetime" certification. There is no need to renew.

May 18-24 is National Safe Boating Week, so we will have information materials on a variety of topics, available for our members. See Erik or myself with questions or additional information.

## MESSAGE FROM YOUR FLEET CAPTAIN

Rockfish Season Update: Striped Bass Spring Season opens this week on the Potomac River. April 20<sup>th</sup> through May 15<sup>th</sup>, below Harry W Nice Bridge (Rt 301), Minimum size 35", 1 per person/day (including charter Capt.). No live eel and no more than 2 hoots.

As of April 11<sup>th</sup>, Virginia officials are weighing whether to cancel this year's fishing season for large rockfish in the Potomac River and Chesapeake Bay out of concern for its dwindling numbers.

Virginia officials are weighing whether to cancel this year's fishing season for large rockfish in the Potomac River and Chesapeake Bay out of concern for its dwindling numbers.

The rockfish season in Virginia will begin April 20 along the Potomac River tributaries, then days later in the bay. But indications that the population of the fish, also called striped bass, is declining raised concerns that further catches could have a long-term effect on its survivability.

"Striped bass aren't doing as well as we thought," said Ellen Bolen, deputy commissioner for the Virginia Marine Resources Commission. "We're taking fish out faster than they can reproduce."

Bolen's group, which helps manage and oversee fish populations in the state, is expected to vote April 23 on an "emergency proposal" that would recommend canceling the trophy-size rockfish season, when anglers can keep rockfish that measure 36 inches or longer.

If the proposal passes, it would become effective April 29 — creating a nine-day season this year along the Potomac's tributaries. A public hearing would be held in late May.

Maryland officials said they have similar concerns about the rockfish population, but there are no efforts to halt the spring rockfish season in the state. Maryland's Department of Natural Resources plans to work with the Atlantic States Marine Fisheries Commission, which regulates fishing in coastal waters, for other possible solutions.

Last year, LCYC took home the bronze and all attending had a wonderful weekend. Please note, this is a piece meal type event, so you don't have to participate in all the meals and or scheduled events. There are several very good seafood restaurants in walking distance, so maybe if we get enough participation, we can skip one of the scheduled events and get a tray full of crabs!

# MESSAGE FROM YOUR BY LAWS COMMITTEE

## LCYC 2019 Bylaw Committee Recommendations

The Bridge moved to create a By-Laws committee to review our current bylaws to address certain issues related to Guest attending our scheduled functions and events.

#### Current Bylaw Section that requires a minor update.

Section 3 - Term of Membership Special Qualification

B. DOCKER Members are those who own a boat or a financial interest in a boat, wet berth or dry stored at Olverson's Marina. DOCKER Member(s) shall have full voting rights per ARTICLE VII hereof.

C. NON-DOCKER membership may be extended to any person(s) who have had a boat once wet berthed or dry stored at Olverson's Marina. NON-DOCKER Members have voting rights per ARTICLE VII hereof. NON-DOCKER memberships may not exceed more than ten (10) percent of the total current membership. Current NON-DOCKER memberships are Grandfathered.

# Currently, the term "berthed" is not clearly defined. The recommended changes are highlighted below.

B. DOCKER Members are those who own a boat or a financial interest in a boat, wet berth or dry stored at Olverson's Marina for longer than 30 days. DOCKER Member(s) shall have full voting rights per ARTICLE VII hereof.

C. NON-DOCKER membership may be extended to any person(s) who have had a boat once wet berthed or dry stored at Olverson's Marina for longer than 30 days.

NON-DOCKER Members have voting rights per ARTICLE VII hereof. NON-DOCKER memberships may not exceed more than ten (10) percent of the total current membership. Current NON-DOCKER memberships are Grandfathered.

Please note: Section 2A is currently in the bylaws and the committed does not recommend any changes to section 2A.

A. A guest is a person or persons not berth at Olverson's Marina.

A person or persons berthed at Olverson's Marina may not attend more than one (1) function as a guest if they are eligible for active membership.

The bridge passed the motion to hold a member meeting on May 18 to vote on the proposed change to our By-laws.
